She said she was kind to her fellow students. "She has a powerful voice and she's learning how to use it."

Aviles hopes to graduate in the spring and then transfer to a four-year university to complete her education. Her goal is to earn a bachelor's degree and then a master's degree. "There is no limit in the things I know I can accomplish," she said.

Aviles works part-time at STCC in Student Financial Services as an advisor to students seeking financial aid - a job that is a great fit for her. She had received financial help that allowed her to finish her first semester free of charge.

Services. Support services provided to students at STCC include the Center for Access Services (CAS), which provides a range of

services for eligible students, including grocery assistance, emergency funds, health insurance, and more; and TRIO Student Services, which helps students in adjust

ing to college life. TRIO prepares students for the transition either from college into a career or into a four-year college or university.

"If it wasn't for STCC's program, I don't think I'd be here," Aviles said. "I want to help other students about the opportunities here at STCC. I want to make sure they get the education they need and deserve. I'm asking out there for support and I hope that I'm able to make a difference."
